Drinker Biddle Partners Appointed to Serve in ABA Antitrust Section Leadership

PHILADELPHIA – Five partners in the Antitrust Practice Group at Drinker Biddle & Reath LLP have been appointed to leadership positions in the Antitrust Section of the American Bar Association. The lawyers practice in the firm’s Chicago, Philadelphia and Washington, D.C., offices.

Washington, D.C., partner M. Kelleher previously served as vice-chair of the Antitrust Section’s Computer and Internet Committee and Business Torts Committee.

Philadelphia partner Joanne C. Lewers also will continue to serve as vice-chair of the Section’s Books and Treatises Committee.

Robert A. Skitol, a senior partner in the Washington, D.C., office, was newly appointed to the associate editor of *Antitrust Magazine*, the Section’s quarterly publication of antitrust articles. Skitol also previously served as co-chair of the Computer Industry Committee.
